JOURNEY PASSAGE

MARK 15

Jesus' Trial before Pilate


¹Very early in the morning the leading priests, the elders, and the teachers of religious law—the entire high council—met to discuss their next step. They bound Jesus, led him away, and took him to Pilate, the Roman governor. ²Pilate asked Jesus, "Are you the king of the Jews?" Jesus replied, "You have said it."

Then the leading priests kept accusing him of many crimes, ⁴ and Pilate asked him, "Aren't you going to answer them? What about all these charges they are bringing against you?" ⁵But Jesus said nothing, much to Pilate's surprise.

⁶Now it was the governor's custom each year during the Passover celebration to release one prisoner—anyone the people requested. ⁷One of the prisoners at that time was Barabbas, a revolutionary who had committed murder in an uprising. ⁸The crowd went to Pilate and asked him to release a prisoner as usual.

⁹"Would you like me to release to you this 'King of the Jews'?" Pilate asked. ¹⁰(For he realized by now that the leading priests had arrested Jesus out of envy.) ¹¹But at this point the leading priests stirred up the crowd to demand the release of Barabbas instead of Jesus. ¹²Pilate asked them, "Then what should I do with this man you call the king of the Jews?" ¹³They shouted back, "Crucify him!" ¹⁴"Why?" Pilate demanded. "What crime has he committed?" But the mob roared even louder, "Crucify him!"

¹⁵So to pacify the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas to them. He ordered Jesus flogged with a lead-tipped whip, then turned him over to the Roman soldiers to be crucified.

The Soldiers Mock Jesus

¹⁶The soldiers took Jesus into the courtyard of the governor's headquarters (called the Praetorium) and called out the entire regiment. ¹⁷They dressed him in a purple robe, and they wove thorn branches into a crown and put it on his head. ¹⁸Then they saluted him and taunted, "Hail! King of the Jews!" ¹⁹And they struck him on the head with a reed stick, spit on him, and dropped to their knees in mock worship. ²⁰When they were finally tired of mocking him, they took off the purple robe and put his own clothes on him again. Then they led him away to be crucified.

The Crucifixion

²¹A passerby named Simon, who was from Cyrene, was coming in from the countryside just then, and the soldiers forced him to carry Jesus' cross. (Simon was the father of Alexander and Rufus.) ²²And they brought Jesus to a place called Golgotha (which means "Place of the Skull"). ²³They offered him wine drugged with myrrh, but he refused it.

²⁴Then the soldiers nailed him to the cross. They divided his clothes and threw dice to decide who would get each piece. ²⁵It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him. ²⁶A sign announced the charge against him. It read, "The King of the Jews." ²⁷Two revolutionaries were crucified with him, one on his right and one on his left.

²⁹The people passing by shouted abuse, shaking their heads in mockery. "Ha! Look at you now!" they yelled at him. "You said you were going to destroy the Temple and rebuild it in three days. ³⁰Well then, save yourself and come down from the cross!"

³¹The leading priests and teachers of religious law also mocked Jesus. "He saved others," they scoffed, "but he can't save himself! ³²Let this Messiah, this King of Israel, come down from the cross so we can see it and believe him!" Even the men who were crucified with Jesus ridiculed him.

The Death of Jesus

out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" ³⁵Some of the bystanders misunderstood and thought he was calling for the prophet Elijah. ³⁶One of them ran and filled a sponge with sour wine, holding it up to him on a reed stick so he could drink. "Wait!" he said. "Let's see whether Elijah comes to take him down!" ³⁷Then Jesus uttered another loud cry and breathed his last. ³⁸And the curtain in the sanctuary of the Temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. ³⁹When the Roman officer who stood facing him saw how he had died, he exclaimed, "This man truly was the Son of God!" ⁴⁰Some women were there, watching from a distance, including Mary Magdalene, Mary (the mother of James the younger and of Joseph), and Salome. ⁴¹They had been followers of Jesus and had cared for him while he was in Galilee. Many other women who had come with him to Jerusalem were also there.

The Burial of Jesus

⁴²This all happened on Friday, the day of preparation, the day before the Sabbath. As evening approached, ⁴³Joseph of Arimathea took a risk and went to Pilate and asked for Jesus' body. (Joseph was an honored member of the high council, and he was waiting for the Kingdom of God to come.) ⁴⁴Pilate couldn't believe that Jesus was already dead, so he called for the Roman officer and asked if he had died yet. ⁴⁵The officer confirmed that Jesus was dead, so Pilate told Joseph he could have the body. ⁴⁶Joseph bought a long sheet of linen cloth. Then he took Jesus' body down from the cross, wrapped it in the cloth, and laid it in a tomb that had been carved out of the rock. Then he rolled a stone in front of the entrance. ⁴⁷Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joseph saw where Jesus' body was laid.

JOURNEY PASSAGE

MARK 16:1-6

The Resurrection

¹Saturday evening, when the Sabbath ended, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome went out and purchased burial spices so they could anoint Jesus' body. ²Very early on Sunday morning, just at sunrise, they went to the tomb. ³On the way they were asking each other, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" ⁴But as they arrived, they looked up and saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled aside. ⁵When they entered the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a white robe sitting on the right side. The women were shocked, ⁶but the angel said, "Don't be alarmed. You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He isn't here! He is risen from the dead! Look, this is where they laid his body.

TRAVEL QUESTIONS

ΑN	ISWERED IN THIS JOURNEY: What does Jesus' Journey to the Cross tell us about eternal salvation
1.	When questioned, why do you think Jesus did not try to defend Himself? (verses 2-5) Also, Mark 8:31; Matthew 16:21.
	Based on these Scriptures, was Jesus' journey to the cross accidental or deliberate?
2.	Why would Jesus deliberately journey to Jerusalem and to the cross? Read John 3:14-18.
	Note: The reference to Moses lifting up a serpent in the wilderness refers to a plague where poisonous snakes were killing many Israelites. (Numbers 21:6-9) The miraculous solution God brought was that a brass serpent was fashioned and put of a pole (like a cross). When the Israelites looked in faith at the serpent, they were miraculously healed-a wonderful symbol of Jesus being lifted up on the cross.
3.	On a human level, why did the leading priests want Jesus crucified? (verse 10)
	On a human level, why did Pilate have Jesus crucified? (verse 15)
	Summary: On a human level, the Jewish and Roman leaders crucified Jesus for sinful reasons. But God had a different plan "Because Christ also suffered for sins once, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring you to God." (1 Pete 3:18a)

¹⁶After his baptism, as Jesus came up out of the water, the heavens were opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and settling on him. ¹⁷And a voice from heaven said, "This is my dearly loved Son, who brings me great joy."

In most circumstances, it is probably best to get baptized soon after receiving Christ as Savior and Lord. In some cultures, baptism can cause anger and persecution. To help ensure a

(But it is an important step of obedience and an outward testimony of our faith in Christ.



The Temptation of Jesus

'Then Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan River. He was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, 'where he was tempted by the devil for forty days. Jesus ate nothing all that time and became very hungry.

³Then the devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become a loaf of bread."

⁴But Jesus told him, "No! The Scriptures say, 'People do not live by bread alone."

⁵Then the devil took him up and revealed to him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time. ⁶"I will give you the glory of these kingdoms and authority over them," the devil said, "because they are mine to give to anyone I please. ⁷I will give it all to you if you will worship me."

⁸Jesus replied, "The Scriptures say, 'You must worship the Lord your God and serve only him."

⁹Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, to the highest point of the Temple, and said, "If you are the Son of God, jump off! ¹⁰For the Scriptures say, 'He will order his angels to protect and guard you. ¹¹And they will hold you up with their hands so you won't

even hurt your foot on a stone." ¹²Jesus responded, "The Scriptures also say, 'You must not test the Lord your God." ¹³When the devil had finished tempting Jesus, he left him until the next opportunity came.

It is not a sin to be tempted. It is a sin to flirt with temptation and to submit to it. (Hebrews 4:15; Matthew 4:1)

Temptation comes from the world (1 John 2:16), the flesh (James 1:13-14), and the devil. (1 Peter 5:8)

God never tempts anyone to sin. (James 1:13)

While it might be difficult to resist temptation, God always provides a way of escape from sin. (1 Corinthians 10:13)

Jesus' Journey to a Mountain Mentoring Focus: Deeper Discipleship

JOURNEY REVIEW

Be sure you are practicing the other lessons covered so far. Please check off these journeys if you are following the practices learned. If not, please go back, review, and work on your area of weakness:

Journey 1 to the Cross: I know that I am saved.

Journey 2 to the Jordan: I have been baptized as a follower of Christ.

In our last lesson, Journey 3, we looked at Jesus' Journey to the Wilderness and learned about how to deal with temptation.

Before moving on to the next journey, we need to answer the question:

"Are you willing to overcome temptations by memorizing Scripture?"



RED: I am stuck. I need help from a mentor.

YELLOW: I am not sure. I've tried before and failed. I need help to overcome my

temptations.

GREEN: With God's help, I have identified Scriptures to help me overcome my

temptations and I am using them to experience victory.

IF YOU CHECKED "RED," before moving on with this journey, review the last journey to make sure you have identified Scriptures that will help you overcome your temptations.

IF YOU CHECKED "YELLOW," continue to use the Scriptures to answer temptation and overcome. Remember "But if we confess our sins to him, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all wickedness." (1 John 1:9) When you stumble, confess your sin immediately, ask the Lord to help you overcome, and then apply God's Word to your temptations each time you are tempted.

IF YOU CHECKED "GREEN," that is great, but remember that you must always be on guard. "Stay alert! Watch out for your great enemy, the devil. He prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour." (1 Peter 5:8)

How faithfully did you carry out the action identified in your previous 'traffic light' reflection? Were you able to communicate the insights you gained with others? If so, with whom did you share your reflections?

JOURNEY PASSAGE

¹² In these days, he went out to the mountain to pray, and he continued all night in prayer to God. ¹³ When it was day, he called his disciples, and from them he chose twelve, whom he also named apostles: ¹⁴ Simon, whom he also named Peter; Andrew, his brother; James; John; Philip; Bartholomew; ¹⁵ Matthew; Thomas; James the son of Alphaeus; Simon who was called the Zealot; ¹⁶ Judas the son of James; and Judas Iscariot, who also became a traitor.

Note: A disciple means "a devoted learner and follower." An "apostle" means "a sent one." These two terms describe what the twelve were to do: learn from Jesus and then be sent out to do His work. Mark 3:14 illustrates this saying, "Then he appointed twelve of them and called them his apostles. They were to accompany him, and he would send them out to preach"
